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
1) GENERAL INFORMATION

The NewDEL[™] Fiber-coupled LED is designed for flexibility and ease of use. Each NewDEL[™] model incorporates its own driver and microcontroller circuitry, so that it is ready to operate right out of the package. Using free Windows based software, users have complete control over a range of parameters, including delays, triggers, pulse durations, as well as PWM frequency and duty cycle.

For users comfortable with writing code, the NewDEL can also be programmed using distinct serial commands which are provided in Section 6.

Twenty standard NewDEL models include narrowband sources that span a spectral range from the UV to the near IR, plus broadband sources; additional wavelengths are available on request.

3) SYSTEM SETUP

a. Unpacking

Each NewDEL Fiber-coupled LED is shipped inside its own storage box (Figure 1). The International socket clip attaches to the AC/DC wall adapter. The available clip options are shown in Figure 3.

Once the NewDEL unit is removed, the USB to RS232 adapter cable is exposed (Figure 2). It is stored under the NewDEL.

b. Tabletop Mounting

The NewDEL Fiber-coupled LED is equipped with rubber feet for placement on a flat surface. There are two other options which require additional mounting hardware sold by LumeDEL.

c. MA35R DIN rail mount kit

The mount kit is used to mount a NewDEL LED source to a standard 35 mm DIN rail. Constructed of glassfiber reinforced Nylon material and designed to work with rail depths of 7.5 mm or greater. When on the DIN rail, the spring-loaded clip "grips" the rail on both the top and bottom lips of the rail.

User installation is possible onto either side of a NewDEL LED source. Remove the cap screws from the selected side of the NewDEL using the hex key wrench and fasten the DIN rail clip on using the (2) flat-head screws (Figure 4) provided in the kit.

d. MA70S Right-angle flange mount pair

This surface mount flange kit contains 2 brackets and 2 screws (Figure 5). The mounting hardware material is black powder coated aluminum. It requires US #8 machine screw, or metric M4 for surface mounting.




Figure 6 – Front panel




Figure 8 Downloading NewDEL software

The software can be downloaded from the website on the <u>Downloads</u> page accessed under "Resources" in the top navigation bar as shown in Figure 8;

The file name is NewDEL.exe. Once downloaded, move it to a file folder of the user's choice. The program will run when clicked.


5) USING THE SOFTWARE

a. Connect the serial port

For operation from a Windows® PC, each NewDEL Fiber-coupled LED is supplied with a Model CA23F USB to RS232 adapter cable (Figure 9). The DB-9 connector mates to the NewDEL Fiber-coupled LED.

b. Connecting to the Software



BEFORE TURNING THE POWER ON FOR THE LED, **REMOVE THE DUST CAP AND ATTACH A FIBEROPTIC PATCH CORD!** DO NOT STARE INTO THE LIGHT EMITTING END OF THE FIBEROPTIC PATCH CORD!




Figure 10 – Automatic connection

Power on the NewDEL Fiber-coupled LED then open the NewDEL software. The connection is automatic indicated by the bright green dot and display of the Firmware (FW) version, Model and Serial numbers (Figure 10).

If the software is open before the LED power is on, use the <u>Connect</u> button to complete the connection (Figure 11).

c. Pulse Width Modulation Operating Mode

Pulse Width Modulation (PWM) is a method of controlling the average power delivered by an electrical signal. It is commonly used with the drive current of LEDs to enable brightness intensity control. Read more about PWM: https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Pulse-width modulation

The default PWM frequency is 490 Hz. The slider bar on the left is used to change the PWM duty cycle (i.e. % LED Intensity).




Figure 13 – Front Panel

- Pulse Period is the inverse of the PWM frequency in units of microseconds.
- Pulse Width is the product of the Pulse Period times the Duty Cycle.



ii. Custom PWM

Selecting Custom PWM (Figure 14) allows the PWM frequency to be user set between 1 Hz and 500 Hz using the slider control.

d. Internal Trigger Mode






Figure 15 Internal Trigger Mode

Internal trigger mode (Figure 15) is used to create a pulse cycle by selecting a delay time (LED Off) and a duration time (LED On). Both values can be set from 10 ms to 32000 ms.

These values can be set by using the slider controls or by entering numbers into the value boxes.

Once the desired values are set, click on the Start button.

If the front panel display is ON, a frequency in Hz will be displayed as long as the sum of delay time and duration time is 1000 ms or less.

e. External Trigger Mode




Figure 16 – External Trigger Mode

Selecting External Trigger Mode provides the operating instructions in the software window (Figure 16). Use 50 ohm BNC cables (not included). The triggering device connects to the TRIGGER port which is optoisolated. The MONITOR port allows the use of an oscilloscope or multimeter to measure the waveform.

f. Terminal Panel (Serial Monitor)

Click the black arrow on the right side of the user interface to reveal the terminal panel (Figure 17). The upper text box is used to enter the serial commands listed in Table 1 and Table 2.

If using the graphic controls on the left, the panel creates a log of each command activated starting at power up and continuing until power down, or if the Clear log button is clicked.
